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Definitions of Critical Thinking (suspend judgment: “one definition harnesses the mind”)

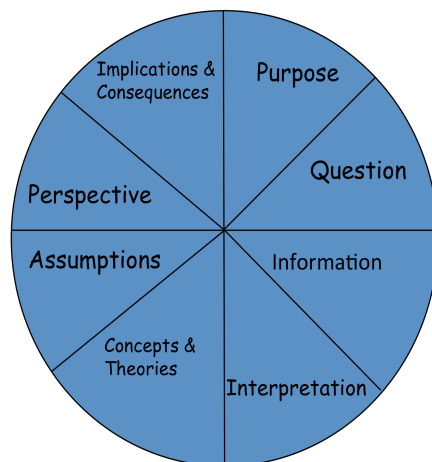
- Thinking that assesses itself
- Thinking about your thinking (with sensitivity to intellectual standards) in order to improve your thinking
- “Criticos” and “Criterion”
- Checking Assumptions & Exploring Alternatives
- Reasonable reflective thinking that is focused on what to believe or do
- The ability and tendency to ask the right questions

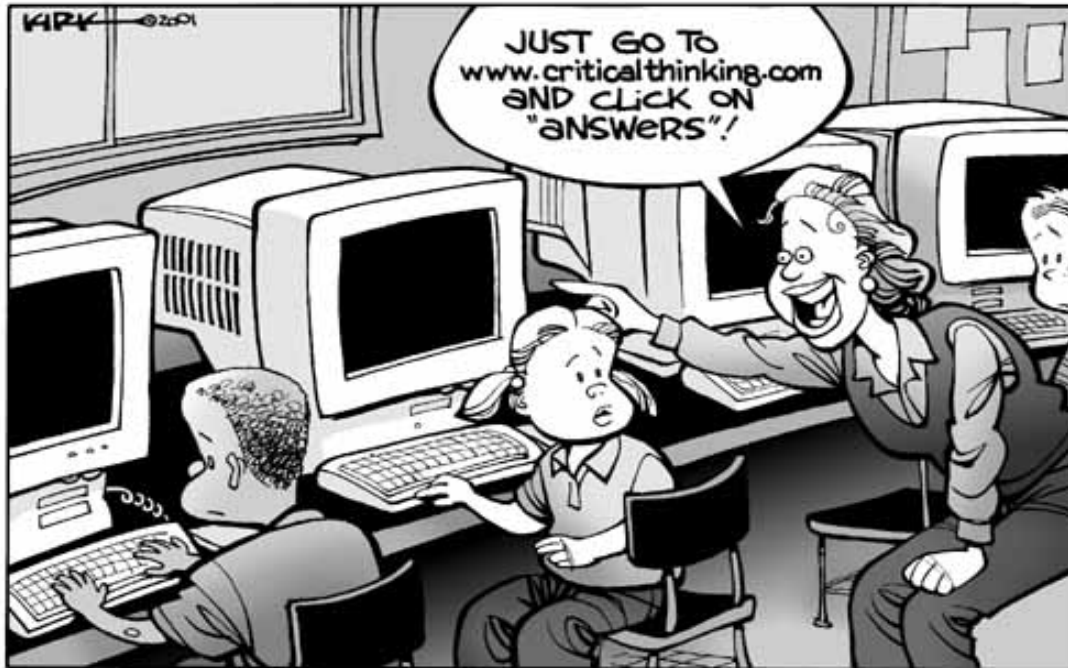
My own emerging definition of Critical Thinking (CT) is . . .
